My name is Haley. The Family Resource Center means so much to me and my family. We had the blessing of starting our family journey like so many others during a tumultuous time, many call COVID19. When we found out we were finally going to be parents we were so excited, but then the questions quickly started coming. Where do we go to get ready? What supplies will we be needing? Is what is happening to me normal? After freaking out and doing a bit of research I quickly found out that no one in our area was hosting any parent preparedness anything in person, and nothing our little family could afford either way. That is when I found the Family Resource Center. I remember calling nervously, awaiting a message saying they were closed or that it was all virtual and then, Carol answered. They got me scheduled to come in within a week.

The first time I showed up I was so nervous, but knew I needed to talk to someone. I had no idea what to expect, especially with the Covid situation and this being my first child. They made it so easy to get the information I needed in a safe friendly environment. The parenting classes have been incredibly helpful. The ability to pick and choose what I felt I needed more information on from day one and along our journey was great. From Mommy nutrition, to what to expect in the first few days, information on postpartum depression, and now toddler twos, the information is there for me. I thought it'd be just classes, but then I learned we could get help in the form of items. The diapers, wipes, baby clothes, general supplies, formula, and especially the Holiday shop were so incredibly unexpected and have been hugely impactful on our lives in ways we never anticipated. Christmas morning wouldn't be possible without the Family Resource Center in our lives. Neither would many of the clothing items for our daughter. And it doesn't stop there!

It isn't just the resources themselves but the people that volunteer there as well. We felt supported while I was pregnant, too, right before having my little one, and even after she was born and we
